The following is based on reports from CBF personnel Rick Sample, Aaron Glenn, and Joy Nee, all in California, West Coordinator Glen Foster in Arizona, Dr. Royce Jones, National DRC for ABC-USA; the Children's Minister for the First Lutheran Church of San Diego; and the leadership of Save the Children, on the ground in San Diego County.

The first observation from all is that this was not another Katrina. Although close to 1,000,000 people were evacuated, all have returned to their undamaged homes with the exception of approximate 4,500 who lived in the 1,800 homes completely destroyed. The state estimates that 90+ % were insured to some extent. According the Insurance Institute of America, more than 75% of all claims are closed or being adjusted. In addition, California was better prepared for this event than the states affected by Katrina.

To this moment, we have not identified even one family that has indicated a need for assistance through any of the above names. Although we are in a position to send some money to the area, I do not wish to do so until we have determined the exact use for it and how we would administer it. I continue to believe we will have an opportunity to work with Save the Children if they decide to offer assistance. Aaron Glenn stated yesterday that all media in the area was urging responders to stay away but to send money to those working in the area such as the Red Cross or Salvation Army. We will continue to monitor the activities in the area and be ready to respond if needed.

Glenn, Bernie, and Laura will be in San Diego next week and may learn more. In the meantime if anyone discovers a specific need please contact me.

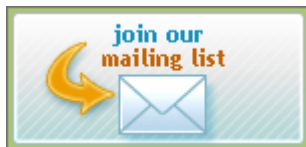
