The Fall Workshop for the McAfee Institute for Healthy Congregations will be held on the McAfee School of Theology campus in Atlanta on Tuesday, October 11, 2005. The workshop will focus on "Understanding Congregations: Traditional, Contemporary, Emergent." Featured speaker will be Chris Seay, pastor of the emergent Ekklesia congregation in Houston, Texas. He will lead in a service of contemporary worship for the Mercer University worship as a part of the conference. At least five practical, small work groups will meet to discuss team building, strategy planning, community outreach, understanding congregational systems, and possibilities for a regional network of contemporary ministries.

PURPOSE

To involve university students in a mission immersion experience with an Unreached People Group through travel to CBF Gypsy ministry sites.

Includes directed journaling and discussion, interviews, contextualized worship, and experiences with people from different cultures, worldviews, and religions—in order to explore a personal call in a world without borders.

Students will critically reflect on the problems and expressed needs of the Gypsy people and consider the factors that make them an oppressed/disadvantaged group. They will have the opportunity through relationships to get involved in ministry relevant to the people group's needs.

WHERE

Romania, Egypt, and India among Gypsies

WHEN

December 16, 2005, thru January 2, 2006

WHO

The team will consist of 8 University students and James and Robbi Francovich, CBF Banjara Gypsy Team.

Team members should display active discipleship, have an interest in study of cultures and world religions, good health, flexibility, able to eat varieties of food and endure difficult travel, open to group discussion and sharing, journal writing, and personal reflection on God's calling to missions.

COST

Approximately \$3,000 depending on cost of round the world travel from US-Bucharest-Cairo-Dubai-Hyderabad-Varanasi-Delhi-US (TBA)
Student.Go will provide \$500 travel allowance and a \$500 stipend for a total of \$1000.
