Fellowship's long-term relief efforts continue in Gulf Coast one year after Hurricane Katrina

Editor's Note: The following stories are part of a series on the one-year anniversary of Hurricane Katrina and the relief work of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship and its partners.

New Orleans, LA: “Our church is going to come back.”

African American churches are on nearly every street corner in some neighborhoods of New Orleans, LA, and many are heavily damaged or nearly destroyed. The need for restoration in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina is just as great as it was one year ago, and Fellowship Baptists are doing their part to restore the city one church at a time.

Lacombe, LA: “We can feel good about what we did there.”

For nearly a year the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of Louisiana has funneled money, time, and volunteers into Lacombe, LA, a small predominantly African American community about 25 miles from New Orleans on the north shore of Lake Pontchartrain. More than 400 volunteers helped work on 56 houses in the community. Many were stripped of mud, mold, and debris. Many were restored.

RICHMOND – Thomas H. Graves, president of Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond since 1991, has announced plans to retire next year.

Graves, 58, citing health reasons, will step down July 1, 2007. He announced his plans during a special called meeting of BTSR's board of trustees Aug. 29.

"I would have wished to work well into the next decade before considering a normal retirement, but my physical condition alone prevents me from doing so," Graves said in a statement to the board. Graves has multiple sclerosis.
